Dr. Kimberly Mathos, is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. She enjoys a combination of work experiences including clinical care, community based participatory research, teaching and community development projects. Dr. Mathos relishes teaching and practicing in team-based service delivery models to offer recovery and rehabilitation oriented care. Dr. Mathos provides clinical care at a variety of academic and community practice sites where individuals with sensory differences present for services. She was the 2009 award winner of the National Alliance of Mental Illness Exemplary Psychiatrist award for her innovative practice ideas.



Anthony Goreczny, Ph.D. has a B.S. in psychology and philosophy from the University of Pittsburgh. He earned his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in psychology at Louisiana State University and completed an internship in Clinical Psychology at Brown University Medical School. Dr. Goreczny is a Pennsylvania State Licensed Psychologist and a Professor of Psychology at Chatham University. Dr. Goreczny has over 40 publications, including many peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters as well as two books. Dr. Goreczny's published works focus on aspects of health psychology and quality of life. He has also given over 50 presentations nationwide.
